Usually, if you want to find snow in South East England in the days before Christmas, you should take a look at a Christmas card - not out of the window.

On the late afternoon of December 10, the trees on the edges of Beacon Wood Country Park appeared autumnal beneath a blue sky (above). The next day, at New Ash Green, we saw frosty plants beneath cloud and gloom.
